
through Friday, year-round, serving approximately 2,700 children daily. *kidsmealshouston.org*

SERMON NOTES



1. How would you describe transformation? What does it look like in terms of the Christian life?

Paul experienced a major transformation when he was on the road to Damascus and had an encounter with God. He realized the life he had been living was completely counter to the life he should be living. He went from a persecutor of Christians to a champion of the Gospel who faced persecution. The persecutor became the persecuted.

Read Philippians 3:1-11.

- 3. Paul gave his resume before Christ, what was your resume before Christ? What did you value, what did you consider important?
- 4. Paul warned in this passage about confidence in the flesh. He meant that we cannot trust in rules or regulations, but rather we must trust solely in the power of Christ. What rules and beliefs do we hold about being a Christian that are separate from simply having faith in Jesus?
- 5. Paul calls everything but knowing Christ "rubbish." That was his image of the contrast between a life with Christ versus his life before Christ. What image would you use to talk about your life before Christ versus your life after Christ?
- 6. Paul says in this passage that he wants to gain Christ, be found in Christ, and to know Christ. What does it look like for you to gain Christ, be found in Christ, and to know Him?
