Count It All

A Summer Series on the Book of Philippians

Philippians 3:12-4:1

Dan Aikins preaching

There is always more to Jesus! That's Paul's message to the Philippians in this passage from the second half of chapter three. Even after decades of living for Jesus, proclaiming the gospel, leading countless people to Jesus, and planting a bunch of churches, Paul doesn't want anyone to think that he has "arrived" in his faith. For Paul,

knowing Jesus and the power of His resurrection is a never-ending adventure worth giving every shred of life to.

- 1. How would you summarize in two or three sentences what Paul is trying to communicate to the Philippians in this passage?
- 2. How did Dan explain the "upward call of God in Jesus Christ"?
- 3. What characterizes mature faith from this passage?
- 4. What does it mean to live as a citizen of heaven who is awaiting the resurrection? What impact does that have on life today?
- 5. Have you ever longed for more from your Christian faith or wondered if you were missing something? What is one area of faith that you would like to explore more or develop? What practical first step will you take to go deeper in this area?
- 6. What were the circumstances that led to you first following Jesus or your childhood faith first coming alive? What has kept your faith going since then?
- 7. Imagine you are having a conversation about faith with a close friend or family member who doesn't share your faith in Jesus. How would you respond if they asked, "So why are you a Christian? What's the point of believing in all of that?"
