Who do YOU know that would make a great **MDPC OFFICER?**

The Nominating Committee seeks your help in identifying members with gifts that equip them for leadership at MDPC. Please prayerfully consider whom God may be preparing to serve as Elders and Deacons, and then submit his/her name online at **nominations.mdpc.org** or by using the printed form inside this brochure. Additional forms are available throughout the campus. Thank you for participating in this important process in the life of MDPC.

What is an Elder?

Together with the Pastors, Elders exercise leadership, government, and discipline, and have responsibilities for the life of our church. They should be persons of faith, dedication, and good judgment. Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian Gospel, both in the church and in the community.

What is a Deacon?

MDPC has reinstated the office of Deacon, starting in 2020. Following the example from Acts 6:1-7, Deacons are uniquely gifted to serve the church by providing ministries of compassion, care-giving, and mercy. Deacons are not a lesser office than an Elder, but have a different giftedness and ministry as they serve the congregation.

What are the primary responsibilities of an Officer?

Through committees, Session, and a variety of other avenues, Officers are responsible for nurturing and strengthening the faith of our congregation, providing spiritual direction, supporting MDPC's programs and goals, and ministering to those in need.

What are the qualifications for Officers?

MDPC has established the following criteria for a person to be considered as a nominee:

- Personal and growing relationship with Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord;
- Commitment to a lifestyle of Christian holiness, which includes fidelity in marriage between a man and a woman, or chaste if single;
- Personal and spiritual maturity, integrity and character;
- Willingness to receive, adopt, and be bound by ECO's Essential Tenets.
- Minimum of one year as an active MDPC member;
- Regular worship service attendance at MDPC;
- Identifiable pattern of financial stewardship to MDPC;
- Willingness to fulfill the duties of the office to which he/she will be elected, which includes Session or Diaconate meeting attendance, serving Communion, and investing in the ministry area to which he/ she has been called.

May I nominate more than one individual?

Yes. Please nominate as many members as you feel called. Each and every nomination will be given the same consideration.

Are self-nominations accepted?

Yes. You may self-nominate using the same form.

Can nominations be anonymous?

Nominations may be anonymous; however, it is helpful for the Nominating Committee to know that a candidate received multiple recommendations.

A Summer Series on the Book of Philippians Philippians 4:15-23 Andrew Adair preaching

This is the final sermon in our summer series on Paul's letter to the Philippians. In these final verses Paul touches on some familiar themes, then concludes with final greetings and a benediction. Paul's love and gratitude for the Philippian Christians are clear, as is his unshakable faith in the Living God.

1. Verses 15-16 take us back to the beginning of the letter where Paul says, *"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now"* (Phil. 1:3). What a powerful dynamic this is, this sharing/partnership in the gospel when it's expressed in concrete ways. God used the generous giving of the Philippian church to encourage and bless Paul, who was called by God to proclaim the Gospel to the non-Jewish world! And, just as God did back in the first century, He continues to do this today. Are there any specific ways God might be calling you to partner with others for the sake of His global purpose in Christ (that could be through prayer, financial giving, or other ways)?

- 2. As Paul explains in v. 18, he understood their giving to be a "*fragrant offering, a sacrifice acceptable and pleasing to God.*" If viewed from purely a human perspective, one might conclude this was nothing more than the giving and receiving that goes on within any human friendship. Paul didn't make that mistake, because he saw this from a Kingdom perspective. When we partner with MDPC (or with other Christian ministries) for the sake of the gospel, do we view our giving this way? Why do you think this kind of giving is pleasing to God?
- 3. In verse 19 Paul makes a bold statement: "*And my God will fully satisfy every need of yours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus.*" Throughout Paul's letters, we see he *really* believed this. Obviously, we need to distinguish between wants and needs, but the key question is do we really believe God will fully satisfy every need of ours according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus? What would it look like if we lived out of this confidence each day? Are there areas in our lives where we particularly struggle with believing this? Have you considered sharing that area with a Christian friend and asking him or her to pray with you about it?
- 4. In verse 21 Paul writes, "*Greet every saint in Christ Jesus*…" Paul views everyone who believes in Jesus as a saint. If you're like me, there are times when we find that hard to believe. We know how often we blow it, how often we choose sin over God's way…and often, most painfully, it's the same sins over and over. Regardless of how we feel or don't feel, the truth of God's word is clear: In Christ, God sees us as "*holy in His sight, without blemish and free from accusation*" (Col. 1:22). Not only is that how we should view ourselves in Christ, it's also how we should view each other. If we really viewed ourselves this way, what difference would it make? If we viewed our Christian brothers and sisters that way, what difference would it make?
- 5. One of the incredible developments that Paul highlights in verse 22 is there are followers of Jesus in the emperor's own household in Rome. The Philippians wouldn't have missed this, and this news would have encouraged and inspired them. God really was using Paul's imprisonment for God's glory. Just as God was doing unexpected things in Caesar's household, God continues to do unexpected things in the world today and that includes places like Iran. Are there situations in the world (maybe even in your own life!) where you find it impossible to really believe that "with God all things are possible"? Ask a Christian friend to pray with you about that situation(s)...asking God to strengthen your hope and confidence in Him.
