SERMON NOTES



The Judge & The Widow Luke 18:1-8 | Pastor Alf Halvorson

Like our parable from last week, today's parable is also only found in Luke's Gospel. It has an introduction and a conclusion, which not all parables contain. And, it has a different context than the focus on riches, possessions, and mammon that we have been working with in Luke 14-17. The context appears to be "when will the kingdom of God come?" Or, "what is our responsibility regarding the Second Coming of Christ?"

- 1. *Read Luke 17:20-37 and Luke 18:8.* Who asked the question about "when will the Kingdom of God come?" What was Jesus' answer in verses 20-37, in Luke 17?
- 2. According to Luke 18:1, what is Luke's explanation for why Jesus told this parable? What has been your experience with praying? Is it easy or hard? Why or why not? In what areas are you tempted to give up or lose heart? Is God's second coming one of those areas where you are tempted to give up?
- 3. *Read Luke 18:2-3*. What do we learn about this judge? What do we gather about this widow? Do you know someone like this judge and/or this widow?
- 4. *Read verses 4-8.* In Luke 11:5-13, God is "so much more" than an earthly parent in trying to meet the requests of children. This is also a 'how much more is God' parable. How is God like and unlike the judge? How is God portrayed here? What might we learn about God's character and goal regarding justice?
- 5. This parable also seems to teach us things about the nature of prayer and the topic of persistence. What are your takeaways on these two subjects? What is the consequence if we don't pray and aren't persistent? How is "the Son of Man finding faith on earth" in vs. 8 tied to our perseverance and prayerfulness?
- 6. As for prayer, and for trusting in God's justice, are you more likely to give up or hang tough? How might this parable help you in your faithfulness moving forward? Can the group pray for you regarding any particular place of injustice, suffering, or weariness?

¹ Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. ² He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. ³ And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.' ⁴ "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'" ⁶ And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷ And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? ⁸ I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"
