

Jesus Blesses Children Luke 18:15-17 | Pastor Alf Halvorson

It is hard to believe that this is the fourteenth parable in our Fall Series on the Parables from Luke. But my hope is that we are beginning to really grasp how Jesus taught during His earthly ministry, and even on His way to Jerusalem and the Cross. And, that we are beginning to anticipate how Jesus might approach a subject or react to a situation, which is a beautiful and powerful thing. To have Jesus in your ear helps you to know more fully how to walk out your faith in your daily life.

Some of the parables we have studied only appear in Luke. However, today's parable, which is really an illustration right after the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, is also found in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark.

- 1. *Read Matt. 19:13-15, Luke 18:15-17,* and *Mark 10:13-16.* What is the same in each story, and how is each telling different?
- 2. Now *read Luke 18:9-14* & then *review Luke 18:15-17*. How might verses 15-17 particularly illustrate verse 14? What do you think Jesus is trying to get at here?
- 3. In verse 15, the disciples tried to prevent parents from bringing their children to Jesus so that He could bless them. There might be many reasons for this. I shared some in my sermon. What are the most likely reasons in your mind? Explain and defend.
- 4. In my message, I talked about how Jesus really revolutionized our view of children. In the Greco-Roman World, children were not viewed the way they are to-day. What positive contribution did Christ's teaching and actions have on how we treat children today? How might this broaden to other groups of people that Jesus associated with on the margins—like Samaritans, women, tax collectors, prostitutes, etc.? How might this impact your forays "into the margins?"
- 5. In verses 16 and 17, Jesus associates certain attitudes or attributes of children to those who gain the Kingdom of God. What attributes of children might help us enter the Kingdom? What attributes would not help us enter the Kingdom?
- 6. In Mark 10:16, Jesus "took them up (the children) in His arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them." How might you literally and symbolically do the same in your life and relationships this week?
