

What is the Bible?



- Biblia = "the books"
- Canon = "rule" or "measuring stick"
- A collection of sacred texts for Jews and Christians
- 66 different books: 39 OT, 27 NT
- 40 different authors; 3 different languages
- Written over 1,600 years
- Single theme: God's redemption of humanity

What is the Bible?



- 5 Literary Genres:
 - History & Narratives
 - Poetry & Wisdom
 - Prophecy & Apocalyptic
 - Gospels
 - Letters

What is the Bible?



- Interpretation Considerations
 - Interpret according to genre
 - Interpret according to context
 - Interpret according to "whole council of God"
 - Interpret according to the plain text
 - Interpret according to the rule of faith
 - Discern between contextual imperatives and timeless imperatives





• 1400–400 BC - Books of the Hebrew Old Testament written

- 250–200 BC The Septuagint, a popular Greek translation of the Old Testament, produced
- A.D. 45–96 AD Books of the Greek New Testament written





- 90 and 118 AD Councils of Jamnia give final affirmation to the Old Testament canon (39 books)
- 140-150 AD Marcion's heretical "New Testament" incites orthodox Christians to establish a NT canon

• 303-306 AD - Diocletian's persecution includes confiscating and destroying New Testament Scriptures

How Did the Bible Come to Be?



- 367 AD Athanasius' Festal Letter lists complete New Testament canon (27 books) for the first time
- 397 AD Council of Carthage establishes orthodox New Testament canon (27 books)





- Books must have apostolic authority; either Apostles themselves or by faithful followers
- Book's message must conform to the Christian rule of faith; consistent with the Christian tradition
- Book must be accepted and used by the Christian church

Manuscripts



- 24,633 manuscript copies of NT, dated 100-300 years after the originals were composed
- Other ancient documents: Caesar 10 copies, 1,000 year gap; Tacitus 20 copies, 1,000 year gap; Plato 7 copies, 1,200 year gap; Aristotle 49 copies, 1,100 year gap



The Dead Sea Scrolls



- Written and hidden by Qumran Essenes.
- Located in Qumran, NW bank of Dead Sea
- Discovered in 1947 by Bedouin shepherd boy
- Dated from 3rd century BC to 1st century AD
- Every OT book except Esther
- Predates previous oldest copies by 1,000 years
- 95% word for word identity

Some Messianic Prophecies Fulfilled



- Messiah to be born of a virgin: Isaiah 7:14, Matt 1:18ff
- Messiah to be born in Bethlehem, Micah 5:2, Matt 2:1ff
- Messiah to be betrayed by friend, Psalm 41:9, John 13:18ff
- Messiah's suffering and death, Isaiah 53:2ff, John 18-19
- Messiah's resurrection, Job 19:25/Psalm 16:10, Acts 2:30-31
- Messiah prophesizes Jerusalem's destruction, Mark 13
- Jerusalem destroyed by Romans in 70 AD

Messianic Prophecies Fulfilled



 Mathematicians have calculated the odds of Jesus fulfilling only 8 Messianic prophecies as 1 in 10¹⁷

Jesus fulfilled 353 prophecies

Evidence of Reliability



- OT/NT prophecies fulfilled in scripture and world history
- Later OT prophets quote OT Law as authoritative
- Jesus and Apostles quoted OT as authoritative
- NT authors cite each other as authoritative
- Very few contradictions in eye-witness accounts
- Jesus taught disciples 40 days after resurrection
- 11 of 12 Apostles martyred for truth of the Gospel
- Gospels and Epistles written by eye-witnesses
